Though the Table of Duties is so very helpful by laying out specific responsibilities for us in our various stations in life, it is also helpful to consider that in the end what we are all called to do is to love - love God and love our neighbor. In other words, the Table of Duties is really just another way of drawing us back to the Ten Commandments and the holy will of God for us. Whatever station we find ourselves in and whatever choice lies before us, we are always to be driven by the question of what is the truly loving thing to do. Sometimes that it is hard and sometimes it is not the thing that others want us to do. But that doesn't change our responsibility to always act in love towards one another. To love is to provide for your neighbor in his time of need, to speak the truth to your neighbor so that he can know what is real, to worship God in truth according to His holy Word. It doesn't matter your age, your gender, or the color of your skin. We are all obligated to love God and one another. And we do so because He first loved us.
