FAITH IN THE WORD

he first commandment is the commandment that governs all the rest. We can only keep the other nine if we can keep the first and keeping the other nine is what it looks like to keep the first. The truth is that we have lots of other gods - things, people, ideas, and pleasures that we hold of higher value in our heart than God. And you can see how this is true of yourself when you consider every time that you have tried to justify or excuse thinking, speaking, or acting in any way other than God has commanded. We try to pretend as though the waters are muddy when they are not. We come up with elaborate stories to explain why we were totally justified in not coming to church. We paint the actions and intentions of others as poorly as we possibly can to justify our anger. We watch and listen to and say inappropriate things under the guise of Christian freedom and standing against legalism. But God sees through it all. He is not fooled by our feeble rationalizations. Either we trust Him implicitly with every fiber of our being or we do not. The commandments show us with complete clarity that we most certainly do not. And our excuses only further condemn us because they ultimately say that God was wrong. Repent. Let the commandments reveal your false gods and get rid of them. Flee to Christ whose perfect fear, love, and trust of the Father led Him to the cross to make full payment for your idolatry so that you may know that God is merciful toward all who repent and cling to Christ.
