FAITH IN THE WORD

For the week of The Third Sunday after Trinity June 16 – June 22, AD 2024

n your Baptism, a rescue mission was carried out on your behalf. Conceived and born in slavery, you were Satan's prisoner bound with the iron chains of your guilt. You had no way out. It was impossible for you to save yourself. But the Lord Jesus came down to earth to offer His sinless life in payment for your sin. His life for yours. He charged right into the midst of your captor and let the devil do his worst, nailing Jesus to the cross. But in doing so, the devil actually provided the very means by which you were set free. Once the debt was paid, there was nothing left to hold you in slavery. In your Baptism, Christ took all that He had done and accomplished on the cross and poured it over your head, dissolving the chains that bound you. He sets you free. In the font, you were snatched out of the kingdom of Satan and brought as a child into the kingdom of God. This was all done as a gift to you. You owe nothing for it. You have nothing that could buy it. God wants you to have it and simply believe that He has done in Baptism everything He has promised forgiven your sins, rescued you from death and the devil, and given you eternal life. Treasure your Baptism. Repent of despising or doubting its rich benefits and use it well as a shield against temptation.

The Catechism

As the head of the family should teach it in a simple way to the household. Pray and confess out loud as much from the order of meditation and prayer as you are able, or as your family size and ages dictate. Learn by heart the verse, catechism, and hymn of the week.

What benefits does Baptism give? It works forgiveness of sins, rescues from death and the devil, and gives eternal salvation to all who believe this, as the words and promises of God declare.

Which are these words and promises of God? Christ our Lord says in the last chapter of Mark: "Whoever believes and is baptized will be saved, but whoever does not believe will be condemned." (Mark 16:16)

How can water do such great things? Certainly not just water, but the word of God in and with the water does these things, along with the faith which trusts this word of God in the water. For without God's word the water is plain water and no Baptism. But with the word of God it is a Baptism, that is, a life-giving water, rich in grace, and a washing of the new birth in the Holy Spirit, as St. Paul says in Titus, chapter three:

"He saved us through the washing of rebirth and renewal by the Holy Spirit, whom He poured out on us generously through Jesus Christ our Savior, so that, having been justified

by His grace, we might become heirs having the hope of eternal life. This is a trustworthy saying." (Titus 3:5-8)
