FAITH IN THE WORD

For the week of The Fifth Sunday after Trinity June 30 – July 6, AD 2024

t is truly a profound and gracious gift of God that through His Church He richly daily forgives our sins. He doesn't do this through magical incantations but through the simple word of absolution which He Himself speaks through His called and ordained ministers. But many will say "Only God can forgive sins." And that is true. The psalmist writes "Against You [God], You only have I sinned and done what is evil in Your sight." (Psalm 51:4) But God chooses to declare His forgiveness through pastors. He authorizes pastors to speak on His behalf, just as ambassadors speak on behalf of the President of the United States. God wants you to hear a living voice and hear His promise of forgiveness. That is why the Lord Jesus established the Office of the Keys, promising to you that when the pastor forgives your sins, it is not his forgiveness but God's forgiveness. And you can hear this forgiveness as often as you need, as often as you are aware of and troubled by your sin. Christ has seen your need and graciously met it. Let us rejoice in the Office of the Keys which Christ has established in His Church and make full use of it as He wants us to.

The Catechism

As the head of the family should teach it in a simple way to the household. Pray and confess out loud as much from the order of meditation and prayer as you are able, or as your family size and ages dictate. Learn by heart the verse, catechism, and hymn of the week.

The Office of the Keys

What is the Office of the Keys?

The Office of the Keys is that special authority which Christ has given to His church on earth to forgive the sins of repentant sinners, but to withhold forgiveness from the unrepentant as long as they do not repent.

Where is this written?

This is what St. John the Evangelist writes in chapter twenty: The Lord Jesus breathed on His disciples and said, "Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive anyone his sins, they are forgiven; if you do not forgive them, they are not forgiven." (John 20:22-23)

What do you believe according to these words?

I believe that when the called ministers of Christ deal with us by His divine command, in particular when they exclude openly unrepentant sinners from the Christian congregation and absolve those who repent of their sins and want to do better, this is just as valid and certain, even in heaven, as if Christ our dear Lord dealt with us Himself.
