FAITH IN THE WORD

he Word of God and His Name - these two things are inseparable. Jesus prayed on the night of His betrayal "O righteous Father...I made known to them (the disciples) your name, and I will continue to make it known, that the love with which you have loved me may be in them and I in them." (John 17:26) The way in which we hallow (that is, keep holy or pure) God's name is by confessing His Word at all times and conducting our lives according to His Word. Everything we say and everything we do either glorifies God's Name or profanes it, makes it dirty. When we tell lies or when we say something about God that is not in His Word or when we disobey the commandments, then we are confessing that we don't believe God's Word, that we don't believe what He has done and promised, and that we don't believe Him to be our Creator. In the same way, when we joyfully speak to God and to our neighbor everything which God Himself has spoken, when we strive to order our lives according to God's will and design which He set forth for us in the Ten Commandments, then we glorify God and confess Him to be not only Creator but also Redeemer. God forgive us when we dishonor His holy and saving Name by our words or our deeds and strengthen us to live and speak joyfully according to His true and lifegiving Word.

The Catechism

As the head of the family should teach it in a simple way to the household. Pray and confess out loud as much from the order of meditation and prayer as you are able, or as your family size and ages dictate. Learn by heart the verse, catechism, and hymn of the week.

The Lord's Prayer – The First Petition Hallowed be Thy name.

What does this mean? God's name is certainly holy in itself, but we pray in this petition that it may be kept holy among us also.

How is God's name kept holy? God's name is kept holy when the Word of God is taught in its truth and purity, and we, as the children of God, also lead holy lives according to it. Help us to do this, dear Father in heaven! But anyone who teaches or lives contrary to God's Word profanes the name of God among us. Protect us from this, heavenly Father!
