The devil is prowling around day and night like a hungry lion, looking for anyone who is not paying attention through prayer and the study of God's Word so that he can confuse and deceive you. But your Father has given you everything you need to resist temptation and send the devil away hungry. He has given you the Bible and He has commanded you to pray to Him in every time of need. He has provided these means of enduring and escaping temptation. God grant us forgiveness for not daily taking up the help and defense He has so graciously provided and strengthen us to fight the good fight of faith and resist every temptation to sin.

The Catechism
