ach of the commandments begins with "We should fear and love God". Obedience begins not with doing but with believing - fearing God's righteous wrath and loving God's Word and His mercy in Christ. It is true that the commandments show us our sin. God clearly tells us what we are to do and what we are not to do. But apart from faith, that command is nothing more than a word of judgment because we do not fear, love, or trust in God above all things. We fear man. We trust our reason and emotions. We love ourselves. Repent. Receive the forgiveness of Jesus and then hear the commandments of God again. When the Christian hears God's commandments he rejoices because in Christ he has been set free from condemnation and turned instead toward both God and his neighbor in love. Now the commandments are a delight because we know they are good and pleasing to God and by the power of the Holy Spirit we are strengthened to actually strive after the holy will of God and live according to the commandments. God grant us His mercy and strength to walk in the fear and love of faith.

The Catechism

As the head of the family should teach it in a simple way to the household. Pray and confess out loud as much from the order of meditation and prayer as you are able, or as your family size and ages dictate. Learn by heart the verse, catechism, and hymn of the week.

The Ten Commandments – First and Second Commandments

First Commandment: You shall have no other gods.

What does this mean? We should fear, love, and trust in God above all things.

Second Commandment: You shall not misuse the name of the LORD your God.

What does this mean? We should fear and love God so that we do not curse, swear, use satanic arts, lie, or deceive by His name, but call upon it in every trouble, pray, praise, and give thanks.
