FAITH IN THE WORD

For the week of The Fourteenth Sunday after Trinity September 1 – September 7, AD 2024

O I have to go to church?" You've probably heard and maybe even asked this question. It's a bad question born of unbelief. It is rooted in the hardness of our hearts that doesn't take seriously the power of the Word of God or our need for the mercy and forgiveness which God only promises to give through the Word and the Holy Sacraments. Going to church is about being with Jesus - receiving life from Him and learning what is right and true and good; it is about be strengthened for the relentless battle against temptation and the devil's relentless assaults. God commanded the Sabbath Day because we need the rest of His salvation, the forgiveness of all our sins. When we gather together around His Word, God makes us new and whole. Without this Word we are lost eternally. May God forgive us for so often despising the Sabbath Day in word and deed and give us faith to keep the Sabbath and indeed, sanctify every day with His Word and prayer.

The Catechism

As the head of the family should teach it in a simple way to the household. Pray and confess out loud as much from the order of meditation and prayer as you are able, or as your family size and ages dictate. Learn by heart the verse, catechism, and hymn of the week.

The Ten Commandments – Third and Fourth Commandments

Third Commandment: Remember the Sabbath day by keeping it holy.

What does this mean? We should fear and love God so that we do not despise preaching and His Word, but hold it sacred and gladly hear and learn it.

Fourth Commandment: Honor your father and your mother.

What does this mean? We should fear and love God so that we do not despise or anger our parents and other authorities, but honor them, serve and obey them, love and cherish them.
