he fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom." The First Commandment directs our fear toward the wrath of God. We are not to take any of God's Commandments or His Word lightly, imagining that God doesn't really mind if we disobey His Word. Holy Scripture is full of examples of people who took the Word of God lightly and did not fear God's wrath against their sin only to later taste that wrath - Cain and his descendants, Egypt, faithless Israel, Jerusalem. Sin has consequences not only for the sinner but for everyone around him. God's wrath will fall on those who do not repent of their sin and turn from it and fight against it. But just as God threatens wrath to the disobedient, He promises blessing to those who do keep the commandments. We sin because we think in doing so we will get something better. But that is the devil's deception. Sin never brings forth good. There is never blessing in our lying, in our despising of God's Word, in our anger, or in our dishonoring of our parents and other authorities. Sin brings death and judgment. But obedience carries with it the promise of God's help. God grant us to fear His wrath and not do anything against His commandments, and that we would turn in repentance to Him when we fall and then eagerly seek to walk according to His Word.

The Catechism

As the head of the family should teach it in a simple way to the household. Pray and confess out loud as much from the order of meditation and prayer as you are able, or as your family size and ages dictate. Learn by heart the verse, catechism, and hymn of the week.

The Close of the Commandments

What does God say about all these commandments?

He says, "I, the Lord your God, am a jealous God, punishing the children for the sin of the fathers to the third and fourth generation of those who hate Me, but showing love to a thousand generations of those who love Me and keep My commandments." (Ex. 20:5-6)

What does this mean? God threatens to punish all who break these commandments. Therefore, we should fear His wrath and not do anything against them. But He promises grace and every blessing to all who keep these commandments. Therefore, we should also love and trust in Him and gladly do what He commands.
