od deeply cares about our physical well-being. That shouldn't surprise us since God is the one who fearfully and wonderfully knit us together in our mother's womb, who knows each of our days, and who has even numbered the hairs on our heads! In the Fifth Commandment, God directs us to care for the body of our neighbor - to feed and clothe him when he is in need, to protect him from harm when he is threatened, and to restrain our anger so that we do not murder or hurt or even wish our neighbor harm. We also ought to love and care for the body that God has given to each of us. We should not abuse our bodies through food or drugs or alcohol. We should treat our bodies with great reverence and honor and modesty as precious gifts from God. Our bodies are not our personal possessions. They are to be used for the glory of God and the good of our neighbor. We are never to turn our anger or despair against ourselves and end the life that belongs only to God. Neither are we to worship our bodies or use them for selfish or vain purposes. Let us seek the forgiveness of Christ for not faithfully caring for either our neighbor's body or our own as we ought and ask God for the Holy Spirit so that we would love and care for the bodies God has made just as He does.

The Catechism

As the head of the family should teach it in a simple way to the household. Pray and confess out loud as much from the order of meditation and prayer as you are able, or as your family size and ages dictate. Learn by heart the verse, catechism, and hymn of the week.

And lead us not into temptation.
