e poor sinners waste so much time and energy and resources trying to make a name for ourselves. We speak a certain way, we dress a certain way, we behave a certain way so that everyone will know and remember us. We strain and strive to glorify ourselves in this world. We think it is our goal, maybe even from God, to become as great or popular or smart or wealthy or successful as possible. But this is idolatry: to have as your god things like popularity or money or power or health. It is expected that good only comes from your hands - the things that you worked for and accomplished. God alone is great and worthy of praise. Anything good we do or accomplish is to His glory. Any good that we have is from His gracious hand. We must daily examine our hearts and minds and ask ourselves, "What is my god? In what or whom do I fear, love, and trust more than anything else in creation?" And when our idols are exposed by the Word of God, we must act quickly to remove those idols from our hearts. Instead, we are to turn in faith to the only one who is God and who is able to make us good by His redemption and the only one who can give us good, namely, the forgiveness of our sins and eternal life which He has given us through our Savior Jesus Christ who has accomplished our eternal salvation the cross.
