# For the week of The Last Sunday of the Church Year November 24 – November 30, AD 2024

onsidering the First Article of the Apostles' Creed gives us the opportunity to consider our duty or our obligation to God as the one who creates, sustains, and protects us. But ideas like duty and obligation are not words that we like to hear. They demand action even when we don't feel like it. We are constantly bombarded with the idea that we shouldn't have to do anything we don't want or like. We see that as too restrictive, unfair, or demanding. And whose flesh doesn't love being told that its own wants and desires are the most important, how you feel about something should always dictate what you do? Our lives as those created by God are lives of holy obligation, holy duty. We belong to God and He created us for His purposes. We don't get to claim any rights against Him. It would be foolish to try to do so. God created us in mercy to bless us with all that is good. When He lays duties upon us, they are for our good, not His. We are daily recipients of His love and care. Dr. Luther lists out a number of those things in his explanation to this article but those are just the tip of the iceberg. We can't claim credit for a single thing we have - from the sheer fact of our existence to our greatest achievements. All glory belongs to God. As such it is our duty to thank and praise God for His goodness and His mercy toward us though we deserve none of it. It is also our duty to use all that He has graciously bestowed upon us for His purposes according to the vocations which He has laid upon us. God grant that we repent of letting our feelings rule us and instead help us that we might in all things thank and praise, serve and obey Him alone.

#### The Catechism

As the head of the family should teach it in a simple way to the household. Pray and confess out loud as much from the order of meditation and prayer as you are able, or as your family size and ages dictate. Learn by heart the verse, catechism, and hymn of the week.

He richly and daily provides me with all that I need to support this body and life. He defends me against all danger and guards and protects me from all evil. All this He does only out

of fatherly, divine goodness and mercy, without any merit or worthiness in me. For all this it is my duty to thank and praise, serve and obey Him. This is most certainly true.
