# For the week of The Twenty-Fourth Sunday after Trinity November 10 – November 16, AD 2024

his past week the people of this nation went to the polls to cast their votes for a variety of different leaders - the President and Vice President, senators and congressmen, judges, and a number of other positions. Maybe you were pleased with the outcome. Maybe you weren't. The idolatry of our hearts likely boiled up as hearts grew anxious awaiting the results. Whether you breathed a sigh of relief or are now more worried than before, repent. Your King still sits on His heavenly throne. Your vocation remains the same. God calls us to honor those in authority because they have received their authority from God. To honor and obey them is to honor and obey God (unless they command us to do something against God's Word). This is certainly easier when "our guy" has won. It's not so easy when "we lost". The truth remains, in either case, that our hope is not in rulers. It remains with God alone. We should be no more or less confident that God is ruling all things in heaven and on earth today than we were before this past Tuesday. We will still pray for our leaders that God would give them faithfulness and wisdom. We will still humbly submit to their authority appropriately and "render unto Caesar the things that belong to Caesar" entrusting ourselves and all things to God's gracious keeping. We are to resist the temptation to speak evil of our leaders, even when we disagree. We will still tend to our families, our churches, and our communities as God has commanded us, living lives of quiet godliness entrusting ourselves to the rich and abundant mercy of God. We will bear witness to Christ to those around us whether we share political ideologies or not. We will continue to gather in our Heavenly Father's house to hear His Word and call upon His Name. These things will never change. What remains the same yesterday, today, and always is Christ, our triumphant King who will return on the clouds to gather His Church into His eternal kingdom. To Him belongs all power and glory, riches and dominion forever and ever.
