FAITH IN THE WORD

For the week of The Twenty-Fifth Sunday after Trinity November 17 – November 23, AD 2024

n the Close of the Commandments God says something that probably sounds strange to us: "I, the Lord your God, am a jealous God." We typically think of jealousy as bad, as angrily wanting something that someone else has or thinking that it is unfair to us that we don't have it. That is sin. That is coveting. But there is a good jealousy as well - God's jealousy for us. He alone is God. No one else created us. No one else redeemed us. No one else can provide for us or help us or save us. He is the only God. Every other thing that we set our trust and hope in is an empty idol that can't do anything to help us. Worse than that, behind every idol is a demon, working to keep us away from Jesus. God doesn't want that for you. God wants you with Him so that you might know fully the riches of His mercy and His love and His protection and His provision. It is good for a wife to be jealous of her husband's love and devotion. He shouldn't give any of his love or devotion to another woman. God's jealousy isn't about wanting something that you have for Himself. His jealousy is for you, He wants to be your God because the truth is that no other god actually exists. The rest are frauds and deceptions thrown up by Satan to lead you away from the one true God – Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Rejoice that God is jealous over you. He wants all your trust and hope and love because He alone is the one who loves you and can bless you with every good and perfect gift.

The Catechism

As the head of the family should teach it in a simple way to the household. Pray and confess out loud as much from the order of meditation and prayer as you are able, or as your family size and ages dictate. Learn by heart the verse, catechism, and hymn of the week.

The Close of the Commandments

What does God say about all these commandments?

He says, "I, the LORD your God, am a jealous God, punishing the children for the sin of the fathers to the third and fourth generation of those who hate Me, but showing love to a thousand generations of those who love Me and keep My commandments." (Ex. 20:5-6)

What does this mean? God threatens to punish all who break these commandments. Therefore, we should fear His wrath and not do anything against them. But He promises grace and every blessing to all who keep these commandments. Therefore, we should also love and trust in Him and gladly do what He commands.
