sn't it amazing to consider all of the things that God our Father gives to us each and every day that we didn't ask for? How often do we pray for the sun to rise in the morning? How often do we pray that water would come flowing out of our faucets at the temperature we like? There are so many things, countless things that God provides to us every day that we never asked for and that we don't bother to give thanks for. He does this purely out of fatherly divine goodness and mercy without any merit or worthiness in us. He doesn't ask if we are Christians before He sends the rain. He simply gives in His mercy because He loves us and He knows that we have needs and that He is the only one who can and will provide them. Thus, when Luther explains the Fifth Petition, he notes that what we are praying for is that God would help us to realize the great depths of His grace and generosity and actually thank and praise Him for giving us all these things. All too often our hearts are cold and hard to the daily bread God gives. We take it for granted and don't stop to consider that if God dealt with us according to what we deserve, we would not only not receive a single good thing but punishment would be heaped upon our heads for all eternity. God grant that we recognize all of the good gifts that God gives and always give Him thanks for them.

## The Catechism

As the head of the family should teach it in a simple way to the household. Pray and confess out loud as much from the order of meditation and prayer as you are able, or as your family size and ages dictate. Learn by heart the verse, catechism, and hymn of the week.

## The Lord's Prayer - The Fourth Petition

## Give us this day our daily bread.

What does this mean? God certainly gives daily bread to everyone without our prayers, even to all evil people, but we pray in this petition that God would lead us to realize this and to receive our daily bread with thanksgiving.

What is meant by daily bread? Daily bread includes everything that has to do with the support and needs of the body, such as food, drink, clothing, shoes, house, home, land, animals, money, goods, a devout husband or wife, devout children, devout workers, devout and faithful rulers, good government, good weather, peace, health, self-control, good reputation, good friends, faithful neighbors, and the like.
