iving as a Christian in the midst of this sinful world requires constant vigilance and prayer. Though we are trying to walk according to the commandments, the world is not and will not stop putting temptation in the way. Ask Joseph about his time in Egypt. Joseph was faithfully going about his vocation serving in the house of Potiphar. But Potiphar's wife had other ideas. She wanted to be unfaithful to her husband. She wanted to draw Joseph into adultery. She tried again and again but by God's grace Joseph resisted. Certainly, this required much prayer on Joseph's part. Hadn't he suffered enough? Shouldn't he be allowed to indulge his flesh in some way? No. The commands of God are clear. "You shall not commit adultery" and "You shall not covet your neighbor's wife." Joseph disciplined his flesh and mind by the power of the Holv Spirit and resisted the temptation and it cost him. As the world when it doesn't get what it wants, so Potiphar's wife, when she was denied her sin, falsely accused Joseph and had him thrown back in prison. But Joseph would rather that then endure the temporal and eternal wrath of God. Likewise, we should expect that the world and our flesh will hate it when we choose God's commandments and will try to punish us for doing so. Pray to God. Ask that He grant you His Holy Spirit so that you would be strengthened against the temptation to adultery and other sins and the hatred of the world as it not only floods you with temptation but also seeks to punish you for obeying the Word of God.

The Catechism
