That is profound! We would never believe that such a thing could be possible. But our faith doesn't rest on what we can understand. It rests on the all-powerful word of our God. With these words and promises our terrified consciences can be swept up out of the darkest despair and into the unfathomable joys of eternal life. God grant that we receive these words with hearty faith and so enjoy the life and salvation that they promise.
