he beauty of the true Christian faith is its simplicity. We simply receive what God says in Holy Scripture. It's no different with Holy Baptism. It is certainly amazing that being baptized with a little water can work the forgiveness of sins, rescue from death and the devil, and give eternal salvation. No one in their wildest dreams would imagine such a thing. But the power of Baptism isn't something you have to imagine. Christ Jesus has very simply and clearly told you what Baptism does. And you know that God's Word has the power to accomplish exactly what it says. After all, God's Word created all things in heaven and on earth. The power of Baptism lies in the Word which God Himself has spoken. And He has told you through His servant St. Paul that "He saved us through the washing of rebirth and renewal by the Holy Spirit." There is no need to try to figure out those words or reinterpret them. They are clear and understandable. Baptism isn't magic. It is commanded and instituted by God for you for the forgiveness of sins. We don't have to understand it. It doesn't have to make sense beyond the fact that I fully believe that what God promises will happen, WILL happen. Repent of any doubt that you have concerning the gift of your baptism and let your heart receive with confidence what God has said. If you are baptized, then you are an heir who has the hope of eternal life. This is a trustworthy saying because it has come from the very mouth of God Himself.

The Catechism

As the head of the family should teach it in a simple way to the household. Pray and confess out loud as much from the order of meditation and prayer as you are able, or as your family size and ages dictate. Learn by heart the verse, catechism, and hymn of the week.

The Sacrament of Holy Baptism, Part 3

How can water do such great things?

Certainly not just water, but the word of God in and with the water does these things, along with the faith which trusts this word of God in the water. For without God's word the water is plain water and no Baptism. But with the word of God it is a Baptism, that is, a life-giving water, rich in grace, and a washing of the new birth in the Holy Spirit, as St. Paul says in Titus, chapter three:

"He saved us through the washing of rebirth and renewal by the Holy Spirit, whom He poured out on us generously through Jesus Christ our Savior, so that, having been justified by His grace, we might become heirs having the hope of eternal life. This is a trustworthy saying." (Titus 3:5-8)
