# **FAITH IN THE WORD**

# For the week of The Second Sunday after Christmas January 5, AD 2025 – January 11, AD 2025

f it were possible for us to see and know all the evil that not only surrounds us but is actively seeking to lead us away from faith to unbelief, we would faint in fear. It's too much. We can't possibly protect ourselves or overcome evil by our own strength. And this is made so much worse when we realize and believe the Scriptures which tell us that every inclination of our own hearts is only evil continually. (Gen. 6:5) It is overwhelming to realize that we are part of the problem. That is why Christ commands us to pray the 7th Petition of the Lord's Prayer - "...but deliver us from evil." We need God to deliver us from the evil that both surrounds us and fills us. We need Him to fill us with His Holy Spirit so that we do not give ourselves over to temptation but instead, meditate on His Word and walk according to His commandments. We must also keep in mind, that sometimes our Father has to send us suffering in order to deliver us from evil. It is suffering when we must deny our flesh what it wants. It can bring suffering to tell our friends and coworkers that we shouldn't gossip about others. It can bring suffering when we speak the truth about Christ against someone who is saying untrue things about Christ and salvation. But you have this promise from God your Father, He will deliver you. He will keep you and protect you and provide for you and, at the last, He will bring all of His children safely to Himself in eternal life. So do not fear the evil that surrounds you or the evil that you feel within your own heart. Commend yourself to His gracious keeping, pray for His help, and fill your heart and your mind with His Word. He will deliver you.

#### The Catechism

As the head of the family should teach it in a simple way to the household. Pray and confess out loud as much from the order of meditation and prayer as you are able, or as your family size and ages dictate. Learn by heart the verse, catechism, and hymn of the week.
