ave you ever wondered why the very first thing we ask for in the Lord's Prayer isn't forgiveness? It's because in the first four things we ask the Lord for, we have fallen far short. We have not hallowed God's name as we ought. We haven't conducted our lives as those who have been graciously been rescued from sin and death. We have resisted the Word and will of God quite often and sought to accomplish our own sinful will instead. And we haven't received our daily bread from God with thankful hearts. For all these things we need forgiveness. Though we deserve God's wrath and punishment for ignoring and despising all His goodness and tender mercies, still He takes great pleasure in forgiving our sins and rescuing us from sitting in the devil's prison house forever. We don't deserve this but He gives it nonetheless. And what heart, having come to know the rich forgiveness of God, can hold the sins of others against them? That would be utter madness! Let us then drink deeply of this forgiveness which Jesus has won for us on the cross and so share that forgiveness with all around us.

The Catechism
