# For the week of Sexagesima February 23 – March 1, AD 2025

he last two petitions of the Lord's Prayer paint an important picture for us. We are surrounded on all sides by forces that want to steal us away from Christ. There are temptations to sin no matter where we go. Temptations to unbelief. Temptations to covet and try to take what belongs to our neighbor. Temptations to trust in things other than the true God. The devil and the world strew our path with all kinds of allurements and false promises. And our flesh is like a dog desperately trying to pull the leash out of our hands and embrace whatever the devil and the world are offering. There are dangers to our bodies, minds, and souls. There is sickness, war, famine, corruption, raging fires, monstrous hurricanes. The devil is causing as much chaos and destruction as he possibly can because he hates God and anyone who dares to trust in God. That is why Jesus gives us these petitions to pray. We need help and lots of it all the time. We are certainly not strong enough to care for or protect ourselves. We can't thwart the devil on our own. We can't stand under the pressures of the world on our own. We can't get ourselves a crumb of bread unless the Lord God provides for it. Left to our own devices we would utterly fall away from Christ and be lost forever. But God has given you these words to pray because He knows how serious your situation is. He has promised to not only hear these petitions but also to answer them "Yes." Pray these petitions daily with great earnestness and in the confidence that your Heavenly Father will do exactly as He has graciously promised.

#### The Catechism

As the head of the family should teach it in a simple way to the household. Pray and confess out loud as much from the order of meditation and prayer as you are able, or as your family size and ages dictate. Learn by heart the verse, catechism, and hymn of the week.

# The Lord's Prayer – The Sixth and Seventh Petitions

## And lead us not into temptation.

What does this mean? God tempts no one. We pray in this petition that God would guard and keep us so that the devil, the world, and our sinful nature may not deceive us or mislead us into false belief, despair, and other great shame and vice. Although we are attacked by these things, we pray that we may finally overcome them and win the victory.

## But deliver us from evil.

What does this mean? We pray in this petition, in summary, that our Father in heaven would rescue us from every evil of body and soul, possessions and reputation, and finally, when our last hour comes, give us a blessed end, and graciously take us from this valley of sorrow to Himself in heaven.
