ith so many difficulties and dangers and temptations and trials all around us, what joy to believe, teach, and confess that God our Father is Almighty! There is nothing that is outside of His power and ability to do. No enemy is too strong. No problem is too difficult. And what is more, not only is God able to do whatever is necessary to bring about your earthly and eternal good, in His Son Jesus, He has shown you His desire to pour out every good and perfect gift. God's power is good. But it is only comforting if you know that He is first and foremost merciful. How terrible would it be if that Almighty God were angry or didn't love you or didn't care about you? How terrible would it be if He only used His power to serve His own selfish desires? How terrible would it be if He only used His power to benefit those who deserved it? None of us would ever receive a single good thing from Him. Praise and thanks be to Almighty God that you have come to know and believe from the Bible that God's love and mercy govern everything He does and how He uses His Almighty power. Because of His love for you He moves everything in heaven and on earth so that you might hear how He sent His Son Jesus to die and save you from sin and everlasting death. And it is this God who loves you who commands and invites you to call upon Him in every trouble and then promises that He will use His almighty power to save you, defend you, and provide for you. And because He is Almighty, there is nothing that He has promised you that He is not able to make happen according to His good and gracious will.

The Catechism
