The pharaoh of hell will seek after you in his mad rage and hatred of God. He will seek to drag you back under his slavery. But do not fear. You have the sure and certain promise of the Lord's deliverance. And what you do suffer, you suffer with the promise that God will turn it to a blessing for you. The Lord will fight for you and you have only to be silent. In Him you will most certainly overcome them and win the victory.
