FAITH IN THE WORD

For the week of Passion Sunday, Palmarum April 13 – April 19, AD 2025

f we would rightly understand the great significance of Good Friday, we must understand the seriousness with which God takes the Divine Law. None of the Commandments are optional. They are not simply suggestions for how to live a better life. They are absolutes. Each and every one of them cries out "DO THIS!" And if we do not, if we do not perfectly keep each and every commandment, if our whole heart, soul, body, and mind are not completely given to God and His Word, then we declare ourselves to be His enemies and usurpers. We, like Barabbas, are insurrectionists against the Divine Majesty, trying to assert again and again our own superiority to God. We will establish what is right and wrong, what is good and what is evil. But God will not give His glory to another - including any of us. The Law is a relentless task master, driving us constantly to do what is good and right and true but only revealing the truth that we are powerless to do such things and quite often don't even want to. For this we should receive God's eternal condemnation. Instead, that condemnation fell to the Lord Jesus Christ who offered Himself in your place so that your rebellion is covered in His humility, your hatred in His love, your greed in His generosity, your doubt in His perfect faith. Take the opportunity this week to consider your life in light of the Ten Commandments, to mourn your sin, and then lift up your eyes to Jesus who died to spare you from the punishment you deserved. God grant that having been forgiven, we may then rejoice to walk according to His will.

The Catechism

As the head of the family should teach it in a simple way to the household. Pray and confess out loud as much from the order of meditation and prayer as you are able, or as your family size and ages dictate. Learn by heart the verse, catechism, and hymn of the week.

The Ten Commandment - The Close of the Commandments

What does God say about all these commandments?

He says I, the LORD, your God, am a jealous God, punishing the children for the sin of the fathers to the third and fourth generation of those who hate Me, but showing love to a thousand generations of those who love Me and keep My commandments. (Ex. 20:5-6)

What does this mean? God threatens to punish all who break these commandments. Therefore, we should fear His wrath and not do anything against them. But He promises grace and every blessing to all who keep these

commandments. Therefore, we should also love and trust in Him, and gladly do what He commands.
