FAITH IN THE WORD

For the week of The Fifth Sunday of Easter, Cantate May 18 – May 24, AD 2025

e confess in the Apostles' Creed that we believe that Jesus Christ, the Father's only Son, is our Lord. We confess that Jesus, by His death and resurrection has redeemed us from sin and death. But for what? What is the fruit of this redemption? Dr. Luther explains this fruit as follows "that I may be His own and live under Him in His kingdom and serve Him in everlasting righteousness, innocence, and blessedness." You have been set free from the tyranny of earning your salvation and living as competitors with your neighbor. Instead, because salvation has been bestowed upon you as a free gift in the waters of Holy Baptism, you are free to walk in the way of love, the way of self-sacrifice. And the amazing thing is that the life of sacrifice is the life of the greatest richness. To believe that Jesus has died for you is to know the God of heaven and earth as your Father who loves and provides for you, who never fails and who never slumbers. It is to believe that all things are already yours in Christ and that what is sacrificed for the good of your neighbor is not loss. You can't lose anything because everything is always yours. Nothing you need at any moment will ever be withheld from you by your Father. This is the nature of God's kingdom - it is a kingdom of love, it is kingdom of giving, it is a kingdom of mercy - and God has graciously bestowed this kingdom upon you.

The Catechism

As the head of the family should teach it in a simple way to the household. Pray and confess out loud as much from the order of meditation and prayer as you are able, or as your family size and ages dictate. Learn by heart the verse, catechism, and hymn of the week.

The Creed – The Second Article

I believe in God, the Father Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth.

What does this mean? I believe that God has made me and all creatures; that He has given me my body and soul, eyes, ears, and all my members, my reason and all my senses, and still takes care of them. He defends me against all danger and guards me against all danger and guards me against all of guards and protects me from all evil. All this He does only out of fatherly, divine goodness and mercy, without any merit or worthiness in me. For all this it is my duty to thank and praise, serve and obey Him.
