Resisting temptation is a truly constant battle - from obeying those in authority over you to always protecting the reputation of your neighbor to keeping yourself from anger to calling upon God in prayer. No matter what we are doing, the devil is seeking an opportunity to take us down like a prowling lion hunting his prey. He waits for a lapse in your attention or a moment of weakness. That is why Christ gave us to pray the Sixth Petition -"and lead us not into temptation." We need the help of the Holy Spirit and the holy angels to keep on fighting and resisting. We need God's Word to constantly be revealing the prowling devil as he tries to hide from view. We need God's strength to resist our own flesh and its evil desires. We need God's truth to recognize the world's lies and speak truth to drive them back. May Christ forgive us for ever letting down our guard and not seeking His help in temptation and may He ever guide and protect us so that we may fight the good fight of faith and resist temptation wherever it comes from.

The Catechism
