FAITH IN THE WORD

For the week of The Third Sunday of Easter, Misericordias Domini May 4 – May 10, AD 2025

t is a very common mistake that people make to think that keeping commandments four through ten is how we love God. "If I'm a good person and treat other people well then I have loved God and He will be pleased with me." But God has very specifically told us how we are to love Him. The second and third commandments give us very clear words about what we must do to love God. In the second commandment God commands that we use His name rightly. That means that we believe and teach and confess in His name only that which is true, only that which He has said. It also means that in every need, big or small, we pray and ask for His help, we praise Him for all that He has done for us, and give thanks for His mercies which are new to us every day. The third commandment directs us to God's Word. His Word is to always be the most important and precious thing to us. We are to believe everything that God has spoken and conduct our lives according to it. We are to take the time to study His Word and learn it, to gather with His people to hear it. God's Word is to be a daily presence in our lives, not just a sometimes or Sunday thing. If we are not doing these things, then we are not loving God and we are inviting His wrath. May Christ forgive us to failing to love Him as He has commanded and by His Holy Spirit lead us to faithfully use His name and devote ourselves to all that He has said.

The Catechism

As the head of the family should teach it in a simple way to the household. Pray and confess out loud as much from the order of meditation and prayer as you are able, or as your family size and ages dictate. Learn by heart the verse, catechism, and hymn of the week.

The Ten Commandments – The Second and Third Commandment

You shall not misuse the name of the LORD your God.

What does this mean? We should fear and love God so that we do not curse, swear, use satanic arts, lie, or deceive by His name, but call upon it in every trouble, pray, praise, and give thanks.

Remember the Sabbath day by keeping it holy.

What does this mean? We should fear and love God so that we do not despise preaching and His Word, but hold it sacred and gladly hear and learn it.
