FAITH IN THE WORD

ou cannot separate the Holy Spirit from Christ. The Holy Spirit is the Lord and Giver of Life and Christ Himself is the Life. Thus, when the Holy Spirit gives life, He gives Christ. Christ our Lord has conquered death. His atoning work and His Word are life. And these are precisely the means by which the Holy Spirit gives life to poor, dead sinners like us. He gathers sinners around the Word and life of Jesus, proclaiming to them forgiveness of their sins and feeding them with the one true sacrifice, the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world, and who now gives us His Flesh to eat and His Blood to drink. Thus, if we would have the Holy Spirit, we must have Jesus and if we would have Jesus we must have the Holy Spirit. This is the truth that gathers us together with our fellow sinners in the Lord's house - we want to be with Jesus and the way to be with Jesus is to receive Him as the Holy Spirit delivers Jesus' gifts to us in Word and in Food. God grant that we do not wrongly separate Jesus from the Spirit as though we are done with Jesus and are now moving on to something "more". Instead, let us rejoice in the gift of the Holy Spirit who brings us Jesus, the author and finisher of our faith.

The Catechism

As the head of the family should teach it in a simple way to the household. Pray and confess out loud as much from the order of meditation and prayer as you are able, or as your family size and ages dictate. Learn by heart the verse, catechism, and hymn of the week.

The Creed – The Third Article

What does this mean? On the Last Day He will raise me and all the dead, and give eternal life to me and all believers in Christ.

This is most certainly true.
