**M**any members. One body united in Christ. Three persons. One God perfectly united in all things. Two glorious but mysterious truths that should be sources of great joy for us. There is absolutely no disunity among the three persons of the one true God. There is only perfect and eternal unity in substance, will, and word. And though we cannot understand the mystery of the Holy Trinity, we boldly and joyfully confess it because it is true. And we know it is true because that is God's self-revelation. No one ever came to the conclusion that God is Triune yet perfectly one. How could we? That doesn't make sense. We aren't capable of wrapping our minds around such things. But we don't need to. Indeed, if I, a limited and sinful creature, can fully comprehend and explain God, He wouldn't be much of a God. Father, Son, and Holy Spirit - this one is God alone and He alone is to be feared, loved, and trusted above all things because He is above all things. "From Him and through Him and to Him are all things." (Romans 11:36) Thus only in Him can all things be united. Only in Him, in the true confession of Him, can we be united to one another. This is even His prayer for us "Holy Father, keep them in Your Name, which You have given Me, that they may be one, even as We are one." (John 17:11) "Oh, the depth of riches and wisdom and knowledge of God! How unsearchable are His judgments and how inscrutable His ways!" (Romans 11:33) God grant for Jesus' sake that we may be one even as He is one.
